

## Fir Cone Wrap (8/31/06)



Unblocked dimensions: 18 by 56 inches

Blocked dimensions: 25 by 66 inches

(Note: if you make this wrap in wool rather than Sea Silk, you will be able to block it out a bit larger.)



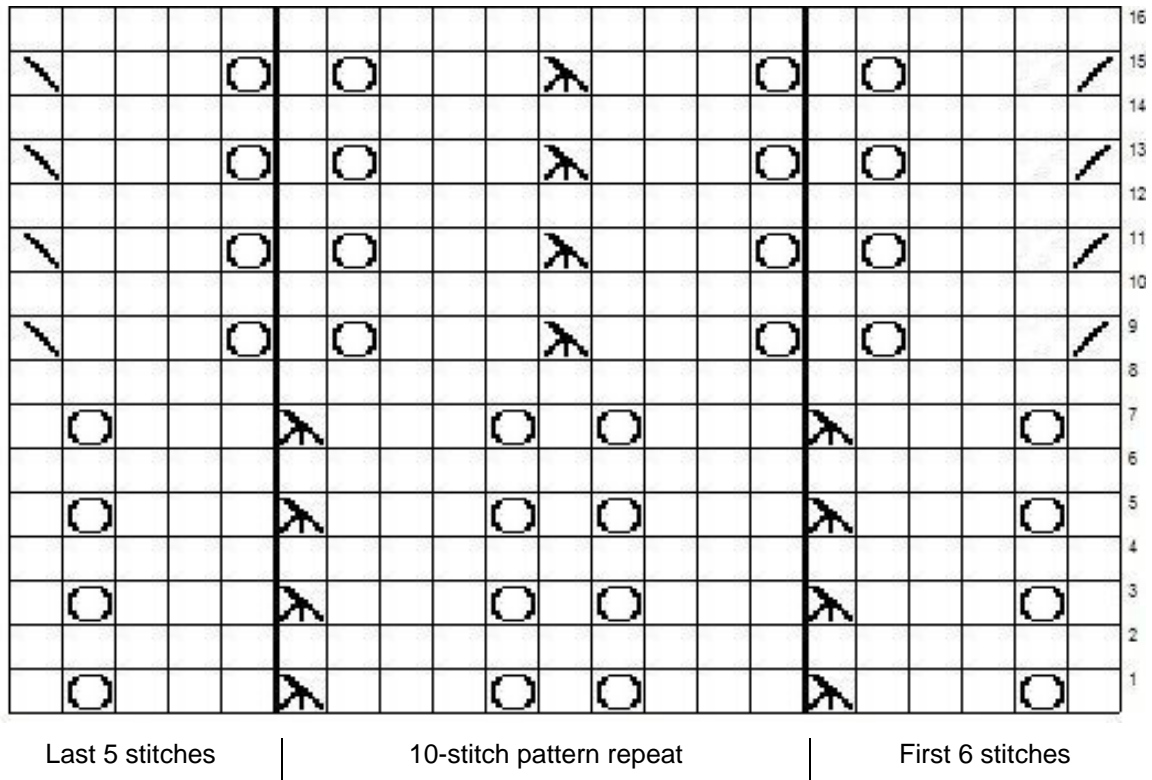
### **Materials needed:**

2 skeins (800 meters total) Handmaiden Sea Silk  
3.75mm and 4.5mm circular needles, 60 or 80 cm long  
Stitch markers

### **Gauge:**

Gauge is not important – you want a lace to fingering weight yarn that will knit at about 12 stitches/5cm on 3.75mm needles, unblocked.

## Fir Cone Lace Chart



### Key

	Knit on right side, purl on wrong side
	Knit 2 together
	SSK
	Yarnover
	Sl1, k2tog, pss0

Using the larger needle, cast on 117 stitches. Knit the first row onto the smaller needle and work a total of 18 rows in garter stitch (knit every row).

Set pattern:

Row 1: K 8, place marker, work the first 6 stitches of the chart, then the 10-stitch pattern repeat to the last 13 stitches, work the last 5 stitches of the chart, place marker, k 8.

Row 2: K 8, purl to last marker, k8.

Continue in this manner working the pattern on the odd numbered rows and working all even numbered rows as row 2.

Work a total of 21 repeats of the 16 row pattern, then work the first 8 rows of the pattern. Work 18 rows in garter stitch and bind off with the larger needle.

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
